

## INTRODUCTION

The Islamic Center of Boston's Sunday School was first established in 1978 for the purpose of providing Muslim children with instruction in Islam, and to teach them to read and understand the message of the Holy Qur'an.

Just by its nature, Sunday school cannot be the sole source of religious information for Muslim children. It is a collaborative effort, and parents play a crucial role in this partnership.

Over the years, the voluntary nature of the teaching staff has remained the same, while the school has expanded to classes from Kindergarten to Grade 10. Religion is a compulsory subject for all students. However, in the first session, students can either learn the Arabic language or gain fluency in Quranic Arabic reading.

## EXPECTATIONS OF STUDENTS

All children enrolled in school are placed in appropriate classes after screening, or being promoted from the previous level.

It is very important that children come to school fully prepared with all necessary materials – pencils, notebooks, and text books. Both boys and girls must dress modestly, and according to Islamic etiquette, girls should bring a scarf for reading of Quran and for prayer.

Children should consider this school as important as the school they attend the rest of the week, and take their responsibilities seriously.

Teachers and students must maintain an environment of mutual respect at all times.

## EXPECTATIONS OF PARENTS

It is important to remember that without the active involvement of parents, a young Muslim child cannot understand or accept the role that religion must have in his/her life. The home environment must foster a love for learning and practicing Islam.

By bringing your child(ren) to the ICB Sunday School on time, you are making a conscious effort to be a positive influence in their religious and spiritual growth.

Parents should check the student's backpack after school each Sunday to see how much homework has been assigned, so the work can be done over the course of the week.

Memorization of *Surahs* must be reinforced on a daily basis. If you don't have time to work on this repetition, acquire or make a recording for the child to practice with.

Parent participation is highly valued at ICB. Many opportunities are available for parent involvement in the school. Parents are requested to fill in a volunteer form and return to school office as ICB Sunday School needs a lot of parental support for smooth operations.

## ATTENDANCE

- 1) Enrolling in Sunday Islamic school requires a commitment to attend for the entire school year.
- 2) Students **MUST** arrive at school by 10:00 am for the first class.

- 3) Absences require a note to the teacher.
- 4) Children must be picked up or met by a parent by 1:20pm.
- 5) In case of inclement weather, "**No School**" announcement will be made at [www.icbwayland.org](http://www.icbwayland.org), and be recorded on the Center's answering machine at 508-358-5885.
- 6) School is open on all Sundays from September to June except the weekend of Memorial Day, Thanksgiving, Eid-ul-Adha and Eid-ul-Fitr.

## HOMEWORK

Limited time for classroom instruction makes it imperative that students stay on track by completing homework and assignments in a timely manner.

Parents should ensure that children come to school with completed homework and projects and should encourage their children to read from classroom materials on a regular basis..

In case of absence, please call or email the teacher to obtain missed assignments. But please be respectful of the teacher's family commitments, and **do not** initiate contact late at night or on Saturdays. Alternatively, your child can contact classmates to get homework. For up-to-date assignment information, many teachers post class notes regularly on the ICB web site under the School/Class Notes section

## SNACKS

ICB provides snack to children during snack break except in Ramadan when children are asked to bring their own snack.

## TUITION

The ICB Sunday School is operated by the generosity of its members. Significant funds are needed to cover the cost of utilities and school equipment. **It is very important that tuition be paid in a timely manner**, either as one payment for the whole year, or in three payments.

Financial Aid is available on request. Tuition is paid in cash or check made out to ICB, Wayland.

Tuition is established by the administration, and revised when necessary to meet the rising operating costs.

## BOOKS AND CURRICULUM

Teachers will send home a letter detailing which books are required for the class.

Parents are expected to purchase these books from ICB, or to acquire them from past students. Some books are used over the course of two years. The average price for books per year is around \$40.00 per class, and is not included in the tuition payment.

Teachers may also suggest optional enrichment books or audio materials which parents may purchase through the school.

The curriculum for all grades is available on Registration Day, or by request from the Principal.

## COMMUNICATION

Email is used as the method of communication between School Administration and parents.

- Parents are responsible for safety of young children at all times.
- Parents are held accountable for any damage to Center property incurred by children.
